


Hit 'em straight.....

Recently a number of people have had this problem. When on the web suddenly a screen pops up that causes the screen to lock up and show the attached warning boxes. While locked-up it does not allow the windows to be closed, a new address to be input in the URL bar or any of the pull down menus to be accessed. Below are images of the windows while locked up (it may have a different text). The first image is a pop-up that requires a clicking of the 'OK' button to get to the following red screen and subsequent pop-up window. DO NOT CALL THE PHONE #

This is called phishing... trying to get your charge card info, it is **NOT A VIRUS**.

Simply go to your power button on the computer and hold it down until the computer shuts down. Give it a minute, and then restart. Everything should be back to normal.



I am now announcing that I will be retiring as your Coffee Hour convener as of the first week of September.


